


## COVID-19 VACCINE UPDATE 17 DECEMBER 2021



## Omicron update

## HOT OFF THE PRESS:



Omicron is the dominant variant in South Africa, thought to account for over 90% of new infections and largely responsible for the fourth wave we are currently experiencing.



Omicron is more infectious than previous variants. Not only does this mean it is spreading faster and more easily, it also means that risk of reinfection is higher. For those who were infected with the Delta variant, their risk of reinfection is 40% higher. Those first infected with the Beta variant face a 60% increase in risk.



Common symptoms of Omicron infection include severe exhaustion, a scratchy throat, dry cough, headache, mild fever, night sweats and body ache.



So far, despite the huge increase in infections, there have been fewer cases of severe illness. By far, the highest number of people requiring hospitalisation are the unvaccinated.



Vaccination remains effective against Omicron. Not only does being fully vaccinated lower your risk of infection, it also offers excellent protection against severe illness and hospitalisation should you become infected. It is vital that as many people as possible get vaccinated, and that those eligible get their booster shots as soon as they are able!
